Long Range Planning Committee

Staff Report

Director Graham noted recent accomplishments & ongoing projects:

- Zoo projects: Wolf fencing 95% complete (Zoological Society assisted with funding); Shelter completed as well as Birds of prey exhibit and front of building
- Christmas decorations up at Washington Park by Park District Staff
- Park District crews have plowed snow and salted park roads and trails twice so far this season
- Pollinator gardens are installed
- HVAC at Nelson Center/Franklin room is in progress
- All parks and golf courses have been winterized
- Routine maintenance continues throughout the district
- Equipment for all parks and facilities is serviced during the winter season
- Golf Maintenance winterized irrigation systems for all four courses
- Draining study with Martin Engineering for Lincoln Greens and well as Pasfield GC bridge repairs
- Repair light standards for Spring while ground is frozen
- Ponds will be monitored, and signage posted when skating is allowed

2020 Bond

Director Flesch explained staff is in the process of evaluating potential projects submitted by areas and will present a list of proposed projects during the January cycle to the Board for their review and discussion.

PARC Grant

Director Harms discussed the possibility of grant opportunity. Staff provided a list of potential projects for submission. Grant requirements require the project be completed within two years' time and would cover 75% of the fee. Eligible projects include brick and mortar facilities. Staff has earmarked potential funding source from 2020 Bond but cautioned the Board that this would require postponement of many master plan and other projects. After a lengthy discussion, each trustee indicated projects in order of preference for submission. The Board then asked Director Harms to contact IDNR to inquire which projects have the best possibility for funding. Once decided, one grant will be submitted.

Staff Report - Marketing

Director Saputo shared the following:

- Deb Clark, Director of Early Education sent out the 1st Constant Contact, which was well received by the public with a 63% click rate.
- Commercials for Sinclair for gift corticates (new) and golf passes are underway
- New marketing for Mommy & Me Skate offering new options
- Grinch Post by Police was well received and picked up by media
- Park District will showcase for submissions in four different categories to the IPRA/IAPD
- Springfield brochure in final preparation

- Final phase for Animal and Zoo Curator. Staff has narrowed the applicants down to two and a recommendation will be brought to the Board very soon.
- Zoo lights are up and running as well as the Botanical floral show
- An open house and Special Meeting will be held to recognize Head Golf Professional, Paul Loutzenhiser on January 8th. Paul will be retiring January 10th.
- A new indoor dog program is in the planning stages at Nelson Center

Ordinance Updates

Discussion of items to either be revised and/or included in the current language of the Rules and Regulations Park Ordinance:

- Smoking and Vaping: After much discussion it was Board consensus to follow state law to include vaping with the smoking language and to update facility rules and post signage indicating where smoking is not allowed.
- Cannabis Control Act: Park District Ordinance to mirror state law
- Tobacco 21: Change current age for tobacco possession from 18 to 21

Other items mentioned for discussion at a later date include:

- Drones (which Federal government has taken authority
- Vehicle Impound
- Il Vehicle Codes

Employee Handbook Update

Staff presented Employee Handbook updates with slight verbal and benefits. Board was asked to review and let staff know if they have any questions. This item will be presented at December Board meeting for approval.

Meeting Minute Records

Trustees have requested staff research video and audio recording and broadcasting meetings for public viewing. A quote of \$15,000 was received to film/record meetings, show live and post on website. In-house voice recording and, posting on-line and would be \$2,500-\$3,000. The Park District has no fulltime IT staff for content management of website. After a lengthy conversation, the Board decided to have voice records of the meetings done by staff and posted online.
